

Honor & remember the babies lost to abortion

The crosses in front of St. Anthony Church (13) & St. Paul Chapel (100) represents those babies lost to abortion in Steuben, Hillsdale, Branch, Williams County this past year. Northeast Indiana Right to Life has provided the following information:

- According to the Indiana Department of Health, there are a total of 354 reported abortions in 2022 prior to the Dobbs decision. Since the Dobbs decision went into effect, giving Indiana the right to make medical abortion illegal with few exceptions, there has been a 58.8% continuing decrease of abortions in 2024, with the reported amount being 146.
- Unfortunately, we will never be able to know the exact number of abortions due to the use of the chemical abortion pill, which the Indiana department of health does not report on.

Franciscans of Mary in Sndiana

Dear parishioners,

It is with great joy that I announce the official opening of our Oratory, a sacred place where we will be able to worship Jesus, who will remain always present in the Tabernacle.

The renovation process took a little longer than expected, as Bishop Rhoades requested that a representative from the Diocesan Liturgy Department carefully inspect and ensure that all work was carried out in full compliance with Canon Law and our Diocesan norms. Thanks be to God, we passed the inspection, and the bishop has expressed his happiness with this project. However, we are asked to follow the instructions the bishop has given us, including what is prescribed in Canon Law #1223:

By the term oratory is understood a place for divine worship designated by permission of the ordinary [Bishop] for the benefit of some community or group of the faithful who gather in it and to which other members of the faithful can also come with the consent of the competent superior [Pastor].

Therefore, the proper title for our sacred space is "Oratory," a name to which we will all become accustomed. In addition, Bishop Rhoades has encouraged us to dedicate the Oratory to the recently canonized young saint, Carlo Acutis. I believe this is both a wonderful idea and a providential choice, since—as we know—St. Carlo Acutis deeply loved the Holy Eucharist. Therefore, the official title of our sacred space will be: Oratory of St. Carlo Acutis. We are especially blessed to already have a photograph of him, as well as a second-class relic (a piece of his clothing).

The official opening of the **Oratory of St. Carlo Acutis** will take place on **Friday, November 7.** In keeping with our tradition of honoring the **Sacred Heart of Jesus** on the First Friday of the month, we will unite this devotion with the solemn opening of our new Oratory. All parishioners are invited to join us for this special day of prayer and celebration. The schedule of events is as follows:

8:30 a.m. – Holy Mass with the Litany of the Sacred Heart

9:15 a.m. – Transfer of the Blessed Sacrament to the Tabernacle of the Oratory, followed by its solemn installation and blessing of the new Statues, including St. Carlo Acutis' photograph.

9:45 a.m. – Fellowship with coffee and donuts in the parish hall

Beginning November 7th, parishioners may request a fob key at the parish office to access the Oratory. Please note that keys are for personal use only and are non-transferable to other people including family or friends (Married couples may request a shared key, if they want) To request access, the following requirements must be met:

- Be a registered parishioner.
- Appear in person at the parish office
- Provide a valid photo ID
- Complete and sign a form acknowledging and accepting all rules listed
- Wait for the pastor's approval of the request.
- Once approved, the parish secretary will contact the applicant to arrange pickup of a key or access code.

Finally, I would like to express my deepest gratitude to all who generously contributed donations and to the many volunteers who dedicated their time and effort to this renovation.

This project would not have been possible without your generosity and commitment. Thank you for your love for Jesus in the Eucharist and for helping make our Oratory a beautiful place of prayer for all. We are still attending to some final details, and I humbly ask for your prayers that the completed Oratory may truly be a worthy dwelling place for Our Lord, Jesus Christ, who deserves only the very best from us. At the same time, we are still gratefully accepting donations, as our budget has become very tight. Your continued support will enable us to bring this project to completion in a manner that reflects the reverence and glory due to Him.

Con gran alegría les anuncio la apertura oficial del Oratorio donde podremos adorar a Jesús que estará siempre presente en el Sagrario. La renovación ha tomado un poco más del tiempo previsto porque el Obispo ha enviado a un representante del departamento Diocesano de Liturgia para inspeccionar si toda la renovación estaba acorde a las normas oficiales del Derecho Canónico y de nuestra Diocesis. Gracias a Dios, hemos pasado la inspección e incluso el Obispo está muy feliz por este proyecto. Sin embargo, tendremos que seguir algunas instrucciones importantes que el Obispo nos ha dado, entre ellas la que el número 1223 del derecho canónico prescribe:

Con el nombre de oratorio se designa un lugar destinado al culto divino con licencia del Ordinario [Bishop], en beneficio de una comunidad o grupo de fieles que acuden allí, al cual también pueden tener acceso otros fieles, con el consentimiento del Superior competente [Pastor].

Por lo tanto el titulo adecuado es **oratorio**, al cual todos nos tendremos que acostumbrar. Además de esto, nuestro Obispo nos ha animado a dedicar nuestro Oratorio al joven santo recien canonizado, Carlos Acutis. Esta idea me ha parecido maravillosa y además es providencial porque como todos sabemos, San Carlos Acutis amaba profundamente la Santa Eucaristía. Ya contamos con una fotografía de él y una reliquia suya de segunda grado (un pedazo de su ropa) Por lo tanto el titulo oficial del Oratorio será:

Oratorio de San Carlos Acutis.

La inauguración oficial del **Oratorio de San Carlo Acutis** tendrá lugar el **viernes 7 de noviembre**. De acuerdo con nuestra tradición de honrar al Sagrado Corazón de Jesús el primer viernes del mes, uniremos esta devoción con la solemne apertura de nuestro nuevo Oratorio. Todos los feligreses están invitados a unirse a nosotros en este día especial de oración y celebración. El programa será el siguiente:

- 8:30 am Santa Misa y recitación de la letanías al Sagrado Corazón.
- 9:15 am Traslado e Instalación del Santísimo Sacramento en el Sagrario del Oratorio seguido de la Bendición de las nuevas imágenes, incluida la fotografía de San Carlo Acutis.
- 9:45 Café y donas gratis en el Salón parroquial

A partir del mismo 7 de noviembre, los feligreses podrán solicitar en la oficina parroquial una llave para acceder al Oratorio que será de uso personal y no se pueden transferir a otras personas incluyendo familiares y amigos (matrimonios pueden solicitar una sola llave para compartir, si lo desean) Para solicitar esa llave se deberán cumplir los siguientes requisitos:

- Ser parroquiano registrado
- Presentarse personalmente en la oficina Parroquial
- Entregar una copia del ID
- Rellenar y firmar un formulario aceptando todas las normativas que ahí aparecen
- Esperar a que el Párroco apruebe la solicitud
- Una vez aprobada la solicitud, la secretaria parroquial se pondrá en contacto con el interesado para que éste venga a recoger la llave o el código de acceso.

Finalmente, quiero agradecer profundamente a todas las personas que han apoyado generosamente con su donación y a todos los voluntarios que trabajaron fuertemente en esta renovación. Este proyecto hubiera sido imposible sin su generosidad. Les pido que sigan orando puesto que nos falta terminar algunos detalles importantes, también les recuerdo que seguimos recibiendo donaciones para este proyecto. Gracias por amar a Jesús Eucaristía.
