A SPIRITUAL DROP FROM OUR PASTOR XXXIII SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

I'm often surprised when I hear so many Christians express surprise about the things happening in the world today. I know—I have to explain what I mean. Many Christians often say things like, "What terrible things are happening in the world," or "Why is there so much injustice against the Catholic Church?" Others worry, "How frightening—this must be the end of the world!" or ask, "Father, please explain why all these things are happening." Etc., etc., etc., etc., and then I ask myself, in wonder: Have these people never read today's Gospel? Fear is one of the devil's most powerful weapons. He uses it to make us distrust God's providence and to sow anxiety within our hearts. Yet a faithful Catholic knows that pain and persecution are part of our earthly inverse. We note that the striple or transdice we force should truly surprise us for Christ forced all those things. journey. None of the trials or tragedies we face should truly surprise us, for Christ foretold all these things journey. None of the trials or tragedies we face should truly surprise us, for Christ foretold all these things nearly two thousand years ago. What we must do is strengthen our faith—through prayer and total surrender to God—so that when the hour of great trial comes, He will find us prepared like good soldiers of Christ. Blind trust in God, daily intimacy with Him, a constant sacramental life, and the unyielding rule of love—these are what strengthen us and prepare our spiritual armor for the great battle of life, for the spiritual and even social struggles we must face. Christians are not called to be mere toy dolls—beautiful to look at yet lifeless within. We are called to be strong and proud warriors of faith, fighting peacefully but wholeheartedly for the Kingdom of Christ to be established in the world. Let us remember what St. Paul tells us: "What will separate us from the love of Christ? Will anguish, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or the sword? As it is written: "For your sake we are being slain all the day; we are looked upon as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we conquer overwhelmingly through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor present things, nor future things, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 8: 35-39) God loves you with great tenderness. Happy Sunday!

La confianza ciega en Dios, la intimidad diaria con Él, la vida sacramental constante, y el regla del amor nos robustecen y preparan nuestro armamento espiritual para la batalla de la vida y para las guerras espirituales e incluso sociales que podamos enfrentar. Los cristianos estamos llamados a ser guerreros fuertes y orgullosos que pelean pacíficamente pero con todo el corazón para el Reino de Cristo se establezca en el mundo. Nunca olvidemos lo que San Pablo nos dice: "¿Quién nos separará del amor de Cristo? ¿Tribulación, o angustia, o persecución, o hambre, o desnudez, o peligro, o espada? Como está escrito: 'Por causa de ti somos muertos todo el tiempo; Somos contados como ovejas de matadero.' Antes, en todas estas cosas somos más que vencedores por medio de aquel que nos amó. Por lo cual estoy seguro de que ni la muerte, ni la vida, ni ángeles, ni principados, ni potestades, ni lo presente, ni lo por venir, ni lo alto, ni lo profundo, ni ninguna otra cosa creada nos podrá separar del amor de Dios, que es en Cristo Jesús Señor nuestro" (Romanos 8, 35-39). 




