A SPIRITUAL DROP FROM OUR PASTOR

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Has it ever happened to you that sometimes you don't feel the presence of Jesus at all? It happens to me many times. We pray, we come to Mass, we adore Him, we sing, but we feel nothing... it is as if He has gone away and we have become abandoned, dry, disoriented... and we ask Him: Where are you? Where have you gone? St. John of the Cross calls this spiritual experience "the dark night of the soul". However, sometimes, to be honest, they are mild dark nights because there are always worse cases, and our situation could be even darker. The key to staying faithful is to never forget that faith is not just about feeling, but knowing with certainty that someone who loves me, even if I don't feel it. Jesus calls us to a deep spiritual maturation that must go through the pain of love, pain that makes us saints. Even if you do not feel Jesus, you continue to fulfill your spiritual obligations with love and you will see that sooner or later this will bear fruit in abundance and your joy will be full.

God loves you with infinite tenderness, Happy Sunday!

San Juan de la Cruz le llama a esta experiencia espiritual "la noche oscura del alma". Sin embargo, a veces, para ser honestos, son leves noches oscuras porque siempre hay casos peores y nuestra situación podría ser más oscura aún. La clave para mantenernos fieles es nunca olvidar que la fe no se trata solamente de sentir, sino de saber con certeza que alguien que me ama, aunque yo no lo sienta. Jesús nos llama a una profunda maduración espiritual que debe atravesar por el dolor del ama, dolor que nos hace santos. Aunque no sientas a Jesús, tú sigue cumpliendo con amor tus obligaciones espirituales y verás que tarde o temprano eso dará fruto en abundancia y tu alegría será plena.

The Assumption is the oldest feast day of Our Lady, but we don't know how it first came to be celebrated.

"Memory of Mary" was celebrated near the "Tomb of Mary" where she was buried, close to Mount Zion, where the early Christian community had lived.

Soon the name was changed to the "Assumption of Mary," since there was more to the feast than her dying. It also proclaimed that she had been taken up, body and soul, into heaven.

The Assumption is God's crowning of His work as Mary ends her earthly life and enters eternity.

The feast turns our eyes in that direction, where we will follow when our earthly life is over.
