Dear Parishioners,

I am happy to share with you all that we will have a Franciscan of Mary postulant. His name is Anthony DiDadive, and he is from Coatesville, Pennsylvania. A postulant is someone who discerns with a religious order his possible vocation to consecrated life. The postulancy is the first step in the formation process for future consecrated people, and the postulants are preparing to officially enter into a religious order, in this case, the Franciscans of Mary priests. During this period, the postulant is dedicated to praying deeply, getting to know the order better to which he wants to belong and will have some minor pastoral duties.

**GIVE THE GIFT OF PRAYER**

Any individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

There is an age-old custom in the Church in which people ask priests to offer a Mass for them. As part of ancient custom, people are expected to make an offering. This is entirely fitting because the Mass is Christ offering Himself for our salvation. It is appropriate to make a small offering that goes to the priest himself. In earlier times, farmers would offer something from their crops. More recently, it would be a small offering of a few dollars. This is not a purchase of the Mass, since the Mass is infinite, but it is a sign that people wish to give something of themselves when they ask a priest to offer the Holy Eucharist for their intentions.

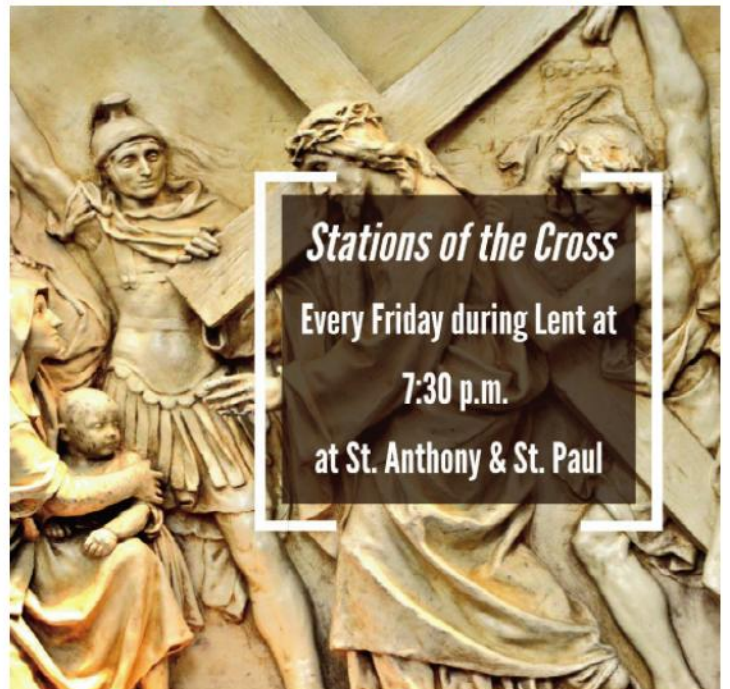

**MONTH 2—DEVELOPING BABY—”I’M DANCING!”**



Your baby is making progress developing all of her external features and internal organs. Her brain is functioning at 40 days. Her mother can hear her heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. Baby-teeth buds are present at 6 1/2 weeks. The central nervous system is functioning and 40 muscle sets begin their first exercises. From this moment, your spiritually adopted baby grows and refines her body. But everything she needs to survive after birth is already present by the end of the eighth week. She is now called a “fetus” a Latin word meaning “little one”. Ultrasound reveals that this little one can now spring, flip and jump – her first dance steps!

**Rite of Sending & Rite of Election -**

The Rite of Sending is the parish celebration that sends catechumens and candidates to the Cathedral for the Rite of Election. The Rite of Sending was developed to allow members of the local community to experience some aspect of the Rite of Election. The Rite of Election or enrollment of names is the recognition of God’s choice to call the catechumens for immediate initiation into the church. Our elect will go to the cathedral in Ft. Wayne and the elect are presented to the Bishop. This rite will coincide with the First Sunday of Lent, March 9<sup>th</sup> which begins the immediate preparation for the celebration of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist at the Easter Vigil. ### On Ash Wednesday fasting and abstinence are mandatory.

On Ash Wednesday, fasting and abstinence are mandatory — as on Good Friday — for those 18–59 years of age. Outside of those limits it is optional. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops explains that “fasting on these days means we can have only one full, meatless meal. Some food can be taken at the other regular mealtimes if necessary but combined they should be less than a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time, but no solid food should be consumed between meals.” Abstinence from eating meat is mandatory from the age of 14. All Fridays of Lent are also required days of abstinence. This also applies to the other Fridays of the year, although depending on the country it can be replaced by another type of mortification or offering such as praying the rosary.

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
