Bags of Loving Comfort (Food) Lenten Alms Giving

In February, your St. Vincent de Paul conference will be collecting food for the blessing box using "Bags of Loving Comfort." YES, THIS IS SOMETHING NEW. Each bag will include a recipe or meal plan along with a shopping list, so that once the bag is filled with the items on that list it will provide a family with a complete set of shelf-stable items that can be prepared into a meal.

Are you willing to give this a try? If so, look for the specially designed plastic ziplock bags in the Gathering Space of church in early February. Choose the bag you are willing to fill and take it






Layers of Collaboration

I have been asked why the work of St. Vincent de Paul is needed when there are agencies such as the trustee's office, Brightpoint, and the welfare system. What I think is important to know is that your St. Vincent de Paul conference often works in concert with these groups to meet the requests of families/individuals who are in need of assistance. When a Vincentian receives a call, they review what that person has already done to obtain help. Sometimes that results in helping them navigate their way through the applications necessary to receive aid from these safety-net organizations. In fact, many of the local trustees know us and work with us to affirm situations and find solutions.

Once these opportunities are exhausted, then the St. Vincent Conference works to fill in a gap in the systems above. This is the next layer of collaboration which is accomplished within the conference itself. No Vincentian makes a decision alone. The one who takes the call will turn to our conference, relaying all the pertinent information so that a consensus can be reached.

Occasionally the needs are too great for our conference to handle alone. Then another layer of collaboration kicks in and our conference president will reach out to a half dozen other area churches that often merge their resources with ours to assist. The strong bonds that have been formed with other area churches is a very unique aspect of our conference. Last year an annual dinner was initiated to celebrate this ecumenical relationship.

Finally we value our supporters who collaborate with us through financial support and prayers. Your Vincentians may be the face and hands to the poor, but their work would never be possible without your support. The mission of St. Vincent de Paul is, "to create a network of friends, inspired by the Gospel, growing in holiness, and building a more just world through personal relationships with and service to people in need." Your support is an important part of the circle of friends that is serving our neighbors in need in Steuben County, thank you. I trust you can see that you are a big part of the many layers of collaboration that come together to serve.

"Charity is the cement that unites communities to God and individuals to each other, so that he who contributes to the union of hearts in a community binds it indissolubly to God" (quote from St. Vincent de Paul).
